

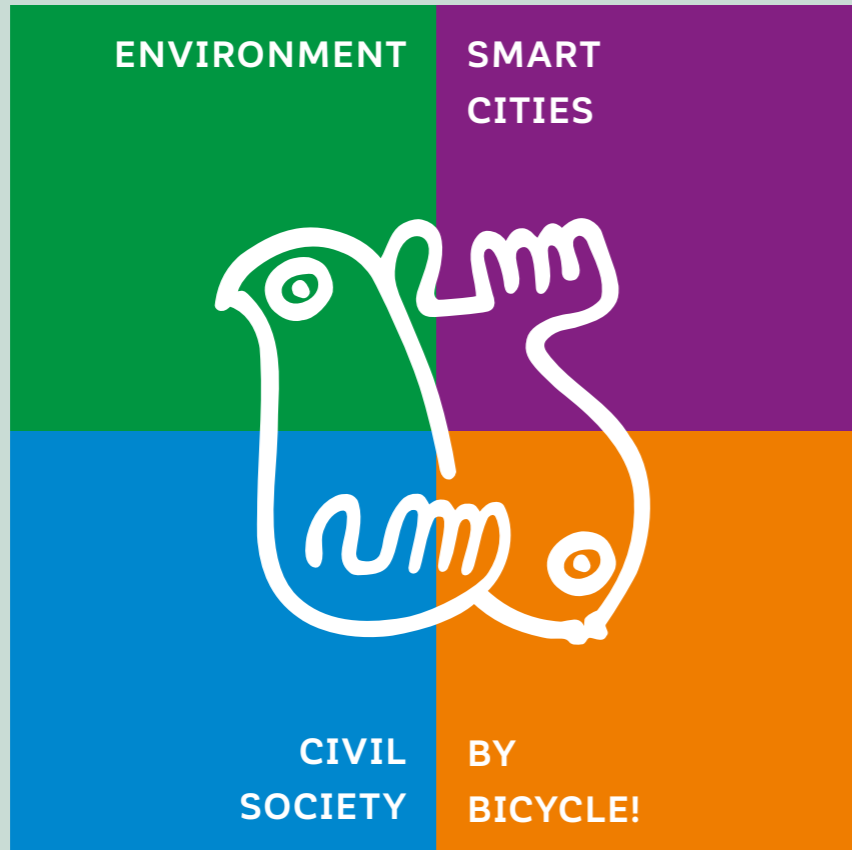

# DEAR FRIENDS

*It seems that in 2023, as humanity, we have definitively entered the most paradoxical period in which we have ever lived. We know that this year was the warmest in history. Every month from June to December 2023 was warmer than the corresponding month in any previous year, last July and August were the two warmest months on record, and 2023 was the first year on record that every day was one degree warmer than pre-industrial levels. According to the European Union's meteorological service Copernicus, temperatures in 2023 are likely to exceed those of any period in at least 100,000 years.*

*The paradox is not that it happens. The paradox is that we know for sure that we are creating a situation for ourselves that will fundamentally worsen the lives of all of us. Paradoxically, instead of investing all our ingenuity and resources in eliminating the causes of climate change, our day-to-day priorities are completely different.*

*The path taken by Slovakia as a country and as a society after the 2023 autumn elections is also paradoxical. In uncertain times, when Russia launched the biggest military conflict beyond our border since the end of the Second World War, Slovakia is moving away from its allies in the European Union and NATO. Ignoring the fact that the European Union is a project that brought to our continent the longest period of peace and prosperity that Europe has ever experienced.*

*For Ekopolis, the year 2023 was already the 30th year of work for our society, and we are determined to continue to contribute to Slovakia being a country of people who reject aggression as a way of solving problems, who are able to help others more and who in their everyday life they will begin to consistently protect the climate and thereby help themselves and those we care about the most.*

## 30 YEARS OF EKOPOLIS FOUNDATION

Ekopolis Foundation celebrated an exceptional jubilee in May 2023. For 30 years, we have been creating space for efforts to protect the environment and the growing interest of people to really help our country. We have been supporting projects of local communities and volunteers within Slovakia for three decades. Since our inception, we have supported more than 3,867 projects of non-governmental organizations, municipalities and civic initiatives in the amount of more than 26.9 million. euro

Through grant programs, we try to bring new ideas, innovative programs and, above all, local solutions to today's environmental problems to society. We support the activities of non-governmental non-profit organizations in cities and local communities throughout Slovakia. However, the real value and benefit of these projects for people and the environment are incalculable.

In 2023, we supported 106 projects, total in € 364 214,80.

Together with the foundations in Bulgaria, the Czech Republic, Hungary, Poland and Romania, we are members of an international consortium Environmental Partnership Association, also we are a member of the European Cyclists Federation, the most influential cycling associations in Europe, as well as European Greenways Association, an association that is dedicated to the creation, promo-

tion and propagation paths for non-motorized transport in Europe. We belong to Civilscape, an international network to support the implementation of the European Land Convention, and we are partners in the Fair Trade initiative, which promotes fair trade ideas.

On May 24, we officially commemorated the 30th anniversary of our foundation. We planned the celebration for May 31 in the Záhrada - Cultural Centre in Banská Bystrica, to which we invited our closest friends, current and former employees of the foundation. And we celebrated it perfectly!

We also ceremonially launched books from Dajama Publishing House – Primeval Forests and The Most Beautiful Trees in Slovakia.

## OUR PROGRAMMES AND PROJECTS

# ENVIRONMENT

## PLANTING FOR THE FUTURE

Planting for the future program involves people in the planning, planting and sustainable care of the trees, which are a symbol of togetherness between people and nature. Our goal is the return the trees to settlements and to the open landscape, which is most affected by human activity. That is, especially in localities where functional green infrastructure is missing or damaged. An important part of the approach of the initiative is the support of local communities - active municipalities, schools, civic associations. Part of the initiative are educational activities to raise awareness of the importance of trees in the country in the form of online moderated discussions with experts. Thanks to supported plantings, a unique database of tree plantings in Slovakia is being created.

In 2023, 22 projects were supported in the amount of 62 thousand euros. To date, the Planting for the future program has supported a total of 52 planting locations, where more than 2,000 volunteers planted 4,123 trees in the open country.

## **GREEN BELT**

The Green Belt grant program supports active citizens and the ongoing care of environmentally valuable local sites that serve the general public, support nature conservation and sustainability. The grant program is organized by the Ekopolis Foundation thanks to a partnership with SLOVNAFT, a.s.

In the 17th year of the Green Belt grant program, the expert committee selected 26 projects, 18 of which received direct financial support. The amount of final support for the other 8 projects was decided by the public in a vote during March. A total of 60,000 euros was allocated to the projects.

### **Inspiring Baťovian garden - Top project 2023**

The project from Partizánske with the name In the spirit of sustainability is an initiative and activity of several women and civic associations that work together here and complement each other synergistically. They started building and planting the garden in 2019. Since then it has grown beautifully. There are many trees, plants, nooks and crannies, many possibilities for the realization of different groups - school groups, parents with children, clients of the day center for people with mental disabilities and the senior center go to the garden. The Baťovian garden received support from Green Belt program for the second time. In 2021, thanks to a grant, they planted trees, bushes, and plants here. In 2023, they obtained funding to collect rainwater from the surrounding neighborhood sheds, as the garden relies mainly on this source of water for watering the greens.

## **TREE OF THE YEAR**

The winner of the poll is a tree that remembers the arrival of the Pálffy family to Malacky.

In the 21st edition of the Tree of the Year contest, more than 19,000 tree lovers cast their votes. They decided that the title of Tree of the Year 2023 will go to Malacky this time. The old oak from Castle Park received 4,201 votes from the public and in February represented Slovakia in the European Tree of the Year voting. The results were announced on March 20 in Brussels.

Just after the winning oak, with 2,966 votes, was placed the plane tree from Žiar nad Hronom, which grows in the courtyard of the bishop's mansion. Pine tree from Žilina, which grows near the well-known Paľová búda, earned third place with 2,112 votes. Each of the winners will receive an assessment and treatment by experts worth 500 euros. The announcement of the results took place on October 13, 2023 in Bratislava.

### **Pálffy Oak of memories**

The Pálffy oak is one of the last trees that began to write its story before the arrival of the Pálffy family in Malacky. All you have to do is slow down and the old tree will tell you stories about noble family, wars, old loves, epidemics, fires and markets. It is one of the oldest specimens located in the grounds of the National Cultural Monument Castle Park, and it, along with trees located in the immediate vicinity of the manor, make up the composition of the park which forms a wild forest.

## **LIVING TRAILS**

The aim of the program is to support the sensitive restoration of the Slovak landscape and to improve its recreational and educational functions. Since 2008,

financial support has been focused on restoring and improving marked tourist trails and public spaces used by tourists.

Thanks to the support of the Horalky brand from Sedita, the Living Trails program helped 6 localities in 2023. Local volunteers renewed the markings on 50 kilometers of hiking and cycling routes, the volunteers cleaned the sites and created new resting places. Footbridges, bridges, benches and a tourist shelter have been added. The amount of 10,200 euros was redistributed to the projects.

**Supported projects:**

- Volunteers from OZ Ferrata HZS Martinské Hole (Malá Fatra) replaced the old damaged wooden bridge on the secured HZS ferrata tourist route in Martinské hole with a new steel bridge. At the same time, they renewed the markings of the entire route (4.2 km).
- The Association for the Development of Mountain Biking created a resting place near the old, beautiful Jewish cemetery in Spišská Magura and renewed the markings on the 7 km cycling route.
- SZOPK Nízke Tatry restored 2 tourist shelters in Vajskovská dolina and also tourist markings on 7 km of trails in this area.
- Volunteers from the civic association Freedom of Movement restored a burnt-out hut in Veľká Fatra and built a shelter, which will be used for overnight stays during ridges and as a refuge in bad weather. The project also included the restoration of a 12km tourist route.
- OZ Zelená hora, Hrabušice, focused on the repair of 12 rest benches in various places of the national park and marking on 16km of hiking trails in the famous gorges of Suchá Belá, Piecky and Veľký Sokol.
- Volunteers from OZ Telekia Vihorlat improved the markings of the access hiking trail to Morské Oko in Vihorlat and built 2 bridges on the route over the Okna stream.

**PROGRAM FOR SOIL**

The For Soil program is focused on the new concept of the so-called regenerative agriculture, which offers procedures for improving the structure and fertility of the soil, and thus the country's resistance to climate instability. The long-term goal is to support the discussion on the sustainable use of the landscape and measures to increase its resistance to the negative consequences of climate change. The context of the entire program is the goal of decarbonization of Europe and Slovakia by 2050.

One of the activities of this cooperation was the realization of an expert seminar with the subtitle "Regenerative agriculture: A response to climate change and the global crisis?", which took place on June 15, 2023 in Bratislava. The event was attended by deputies of the National Council, farmers, representatives of ministries, state institutions, the professional public and the academic community.

**PILSNER URQUELL ENDOWMENT FUND “FOR THE FUTURE!”**

Pilsner Urquell Endowment Fund Slovakia “For the future!” at the Ekopolis Foundation was established in the fall of 2021. The purpose of the fund is to support and implement public benefit activities and projects that contribute to adaptation to climate change.

Brewers, barley growers and experts from the Ekopolis Foundation brought the unique project For Barley to another region of Slovakia. It applies the principles of so-called agroforestry, thereby helping to prevent deterioration of quality soil, improving its fertility and solving the problem with water - its lack and the risk of floods. Thanks to the project, the Rozkvet agricultural cooperative in the

village of Odorín in eastern Slovakia planted 75 alder, poplar, willow and elm seedlings. The planting was preceded by the preparation of a professional study, which defined specific agroforestry procedures and suitable measures for the cooperative, which will help it to better influence the regulation of surface runoff from agricultural areas and soil moisture.

We presented the topics of regenerative agriculture for the first time at the Agrokomplex exhibition center in Nitra in August 2023.

## OUR OTHERS PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES

### BIODIVERSITY ACTION IN TESCO AREALS

The project is aimed at improving conditions for biodiversity at four selected Tesco department stores. In the cities of Trnava, Partizánske, Prešov and Humenné, visitors to the Tesco hypermarket can look forward to a more pleasant and beautiful environment. Thanks to the cooperation with the Ekopolis Foundation, it was possible to modify the adjacent areas and plant new greenery, which will also improve the diversity of nature in the given locations. In 2023, maintenance of all campuses was underway.

### LEARNING LANDSCAPES - LELA PROJECT

The project is financially supported by the European Structural and Investment Funds. The amount of the non-refundable financial contribution is €197,144.21 Learning Landscapes (LeLa).

The Learning Landscapes (LeLa) project develops the concept of a unique event "LE: NOTRE Landscape Forum", which provides an opportunity for informal discussion, creative interaction and dialogue between landscape architects, landscape architects and other professionals during workshops and excursions.

### Discussion on How to create public space for people?

On Saturday, August 19, a discussion on city planning was held with three mayors, an architect and the White Crow, as part of the international Learning Landscape project and was organized by the Ekopolis Foundation and SPU Nitra. The event was held as part of the HUMANITY festival. The guests were: Vladimír Maňka, mayor of the city of Zvolen, Peter Bročka, mayor of the city of Trnava, Matúš Vallo, mayor of the city of Bratislava and Attila Tóth, landscape architect, head of the Department of Landscape Architecture, Slovak Agricultural University in Nitra. The moderator of the discussion was Martina Paulíková from the Ekopolis Foundation.

The project was successfully completed in 2023.

### THREE SCHOOL PLANTING PROJECTS WITH KAUFLAND

The competition was created as an initiative of the Kaufland company to support environmental education and improve local biodiversity in the form of planting trees in school campuses at selected schools. The professional guarantor was the Ekopolis Foundation, which covered the overall implementation together with professional interpretation and the participation of pupils in the preparation and implementation itself. In total, three schools were supported - in Nitra, Komárno and Bardejov, where fruit trees and bushes were planted.

### BIODIVERSITY IN CITY - NOVÁ CVERNOVKA FOR PEOPLE AND NATURE

For several years now, we have always been meeting with volunteers from Deutsche Telekom Services Europe - Slovakia in Nová Cvernovka in September to help the local community. It was the same on Thursday, September 21. A group of active employees will always help with what is current for Cvernovka. This time,

they worked on digging a hundred curbs in a 50-meter section and digging out the gravel from the permeable pavement and moving it to a place where they can practically re-use it again later. The walkway was about 60 meters long and about 4 tons of gravel was carried. The second group mixed and moved the compost, the matured, sifted part of which was spread into the permaculture garden. We thank all the skilled volunteers and keep our fingers crossed for Cvernovka.

### **RIVER OF ČIERNY HRON IS A BIT CLEANER NOW - WE HELP TO CLEAN IT UP!**

On May 29, 2023, in cooperation with our corporate partner L'Oréal, we collected 1.5 tons of waste along the Čierna Hron river between Hronec and Čierny Balog, in a length of approximately 2 kilometers. Volunteers also cleaned the surroundings of the river from the invasive plant - Fallopia japonica. Approximately 70 volunteers helped, and valuable cooperation was also provided by the civic association VYDRA, as well as the mayor of Čierny Balog, who ensured the removal of the collected waste.

### **RUNNING FOR THE FUTURE - FOR THE 2ND TIME RUNNING FOR THE TREES**

In June, the 2nd year of the Festival Charity Run for the Future took place, organized by the J.G. Tajovsky Theater from Zvolen in cooperation with the city of Zvolen and other partners. This time, too, the participants could participate not only in a meaningful physical and healthy activity, but the proceeds from the entry fee again went to the trees in the Planting for the Future program.

### **KAUFLAND FESTIVAL FOR CHILDREN**

The first Sunday of June belonged to the children at the first Kaufland festival for children. And we were there as well - we also completed an interesting and rich program when, as part of our activities with the children, we explored trees and

their inhabitants, and together with their parents they could make their own insect hotel or birdhouse. And we also presented the new twin-book Primeval Forests and The Most Beautiful Trees in Slovakia from Dajama Publishing House.

### **MEMORIAL LINDEN TREE PLANTING**

We ended the planting season of 2023 very symbolically. On the occasion of the late 90th birthday of the charismatic Olga Havlova, we were honored to be part of the planting of a commemorative linden tree in M. Čulen Park in Bratislava. This is the sixth tree outside the borders of the Czech Republic and at the same time the first tree planted abroad in honor of Mrs. Olga in 2023. The symbolic planting took place thanks to the initiative Výbor dobre vôle - Olga Havlova Foundation, which was represented by director Monika Granja together with a member of the Board of Directors Mr. Ivan Gabal. The planting was also attended by Norbert Kurilla, the advisor to the President from the Office of the President of the Slovak Republic, Jakub Mrva, the vice-mayor of Bratislava - the capital of the Slovak Republic, and the dissident, Mrs. Jolana Kusá, was also presented. It is a great honor for us that we, representatives from the Ekopolis Foundation, closed this circle and together with our initiative Planting for the Future, we dedicated a symbolic tree - a small-leaved linden tree, so that it would be a living witness to the legacy of Olga Havel, the first lady of the Czechs and Slovaks.

### **PROJECT EKO ALARM**

The Eko Alarm project, whose goal was to introduce sorted collection in schools and spread awareness about the correct sorting and prevention of waste, was formally completed in 2023.

# CIVIL SOCIETY

## ACTIVE CITIZENS FUND - SLOVAKIA

Active Citizens Fund – Slovakia (ACF) is a grant program aimed at strengthening civil society, supporting active citizenship and improving the position of vulnerable groups in Slovakia. ACF supports Slovak civic organizations in involving citizens in decision-making and in the creation of public policies, in efforts to create better conditions for good governance, in the protection of human rights and in the provision of civic education, and in improving the position of vulnerable groups in society. Special attention is paid to young people and their participation in public events.

Active Citizens Fund is part of the financial assistance of Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway to 15 member states of the European Union. ACF in Slovakia is managed by the Ekopolis Foundation in partnership with the Open Society Foundation and the Carpathian Foundation. In the period 2018-2023, the program distributed a total of 7.7 million EUR for projects of Slovak civil organizations and provided other supporting activities, e.g. education in the field of project management, organizational development and self-financing.

The Active Citizens Fund – Slovakia program is in the final phase of project completion and final reporting. Total of 188 projects were supported in the project within three rounds of open calls.

- 42 projects in the topic of Increased citizens participation in civic activities
- 22 projects on the topic of Strengthened civil society advocacy and watchdog role
- 20 projects on the topic of Increased support for human rights and civic education
- 72 projects on the topic of Vulnerable group empowered
- 23 projects in the topic of Enhanced capacity and sustainability of civil society
- 9 projects in a separate Bilateral fund.

### Activities:

#### ANNUAL REVIEW MEETING

From April 18 to April 20, the annual meeting was held within the framework of the Active Citizens Fund - Slovakia program. The three-day meeting was attended by representatives of the financial aid of Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway, representatives of the Ministry of Investments, Regional Development and Informatization, representatives of the Norwegian Embassy in Slovakia and representatives of the management organizations - the Ekopolis Foundation, the Open Society Foundation and the Carpathian Foundation, together with the addressed grantees of the Active Citizens Fund program - Slovakia. During three days, the representatives of the management organizations informed the funders about the current development of the program, introduced them to specific projects and pointed out the diversity of the Active Citizens Fund program in Slovakia.

#### OUR MARKS

A series of blog posts in the form of interviews, photos and videos that cross-sectionally illustrate the supported projects throughout the program period. In this form, our grantees leave a link and share their experience with project implementation within the ACF program.

#### THE FUTURE OF NGO FINANCING CONFERENCE

On February 15, 2023, the Future of NGO Financing Conference took place in the community-coworking centre 365.labb in Banská Bystrica. The conference was about multi-source financing of NGO activities, where the participants learned "How not to become dependent on public funding sources".

## **EUROPE FOR CITIZENS - RECLAIM OUR CIVIL SPACE!**

Project Reclaim Our Civil Space! dealt with the trend of limiting the space for the activity of non-governmental organizations in Central European countries. Through this initiative, together with partners from Hungary, Poland, the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Serbia, Romania, Bulgaria and experts from Norway, we wanted to help connect organizations that are interested in this phenomenon, provide them with more information from the domestic environment and from abroad, and also bring more skills how to work together and how to deal with this problem. The partners also collected suggestions and processed proposals for central EU institutions.

In 2023, we introduced an eight-part Podcast serie about civil society - what the civil society really is and what are its functions? Why is it good for people to be able to freely associate in non-profit organizations? Why do advanced democracies make sure that the non-profit sector develops in them and is a problem for dictatorial regimes? Who makes up civil society, what are its tasks and what challenges does it currently face? Which trends can we observe not only in Slovakia, but also in the region? Should the academic community have an influence on social events? How do cultural and community centers, islands of democratic values in the regions work? Experts and representatives of organizations answered all these questions in our new Podcast Reclaim Our Civil Space!.

Project "Reclaim our Civil Space!" was implemented with the support of Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway through the EEA and Norway Grants Fund for Regional Cooperation.

## **ASSISTANCE TO PERSONS FROM UKRAINE IN THEIR ENTRY AND INTEGRATION TO THE**

## **TERRITORY OF THE SLOVAK REPUBLIC - NGOS**

Non-governmental and non-profit organizations, which since February 24, 2022 provided humanitarian aid to refugees from Ukraine at the border and later implemented integration activities for more than 100,000 emigrants from Ukraine, who received the status of temporary refuge in Slovakia, could from March 3, 2023, during the year 2023 apply for financial contributions to cover humanitarian and integration activities. Resources were redistributed by a consortium of six foundations led by the Open Society Foundation.

In three open calls, the Ekopolis Foundation supported 16 organizations in the amount of 2,786,296.60 euros.

The national project "Assistance to persons from Ukraine in their entry and integration to the territory of the Slovak Republic - NGOs" is a joint response of the state and the non-profit sector to the crisis situation. It is the result of cooperation between public authorities, in particular the Ministry of Labour, Social Affairs and Family of the Slovak Republic, the Plenipotentiary of the Government of the Slovak Republic for the Development of Civil Society, the Ministry of the Interior of the Slovak Republic and actors from the non-governmental sector. The project was implemented thanks to support from the European Social Fund and the European Regional Development Fund within the Operational Program Human Resources.

## **PROGRAM OF DEVELOPMENT OF THE ROMA COMMUNITY**

The aim of the program is to support projects in Roma communities aimed at the healthy development of children at an early age and improving the environment in which children grow up. When implementing projects, great emphasis is placed on working with whole families and involving the wider community.

The current year of the program is the fifth supported in a row and is based on previous experience and results.

In 2023, the next cycle of the Roma Community Development Program, which has been implemented by the Carpathian Foundation in cooperation with the Ekopolis Foundation continuously since 2015, was completed. So far, 38 projects of selected non-governmental organizations with considerable experience in this topic have been supported under the program. In the last two cycles, the program focused on supporting initiatives aimed at early child and family care. Supported organizations have been working directly in segregated locations for a long time with selected families with children of preschool age. During the cycle, in cooperation with the Research Institute of Child Psychology and Pathopsychology, specialized measurements of children's development were repeatedly implemented and evaluated with the aim of designing an individual development plan for each child based mainly on education in the family. The result of the program is not only that children are better prepared for entering primary school, but also the verification of the effectiveness of various educational models of early care for children in excluded Roma communities.

# SMART CITIES

## **GOOD NEIGHBOR**

The Good Neighbor grant program is a practical and targeted help in implementing the ideas of residents from the vicinity of the Slovnaft refinery in the following urban districts of Bratislava: Ružinov, Vrakuňa, Podunajské Biskupice, Rovinka, and from 2023 also Petržalka, Dunajská Lužná and Most pri Bratislave were added.

The Good Neighbor supported eighteen community projects in 2023 and redistributed a total of 32,700 euros to the ideas of volunteers.

The Good Neighbor grant program is aimed at supporting the cooperation of active citizens, which maintains and develops good neighborly relations. One of the goals of the program is to support cooperation and partnerships of municipalities, school facilities and civic associations. Over the past five years, the program has supported more than 60 good intentions and useful solutions.

# BY BICYCLE!

## **ICTR-CE**

The Iron Curtain Route, included in the EuroVelo route network under number 13, is a long-distance cycling route, leading along the former border between the democratic West and the totalitarian East. It is 10,500km long and runs from

the Barents Sea in the north to the Black Sea in the south. Due to the fact that for decades this area was closed to the public, for most of its length it is an area that is rare from the point of view of natural and cultural heritage, but in many sections it is less developed, sparsely populated and with less availability of services for tourists.

In Slovakia, the EuroVelo 13 Route of the Iron Curtain runs from the border bridge between Hohenau and Moravský Sv. Ján to the border of the Austrian village of Kittsee, adjacent to Bratislava. The length is roughly 90 kilometers and, with the exception of the Bratislava area, it mainly leads through less populated, but all the more interesting areas along the Morava River. The cycle route is currently mainly used by recreational cyclists, but it has great potential for cycle tourism and thus for service providers in the adjacent villages and towns. The ICTr-CE project (Innovative participatory and sustainable business model for cycle tourism on the Iron Curtain Road) is focused on better utilization of this potential.

The project partners are 11 organizations from 8 countries. The project is implemented thanks to the support of Interreg Central Europe.

## **WELCOME CYCLIST!**

Certification scheme Welcome cyclists! was launched in Slovakia in May 2008. It is inspired by certification schemes in Germany (Bett&Bike), Austria and Switzerland and is directly based on the Cyclists are welcome certification. The goal of the certification is to increase the number of tourist facilities and services that are adapted to the needs of cyclists and thereby support bicycle transport and bicycle tourism in Slovakia.

After a pause caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, we renewed our certification Welcome, cyclists! In 2023 with significant changes. We simplified the criteria because the original ones from 2008 did not reflect phenomena such as the de-

velopment of mobile information technologies or the boom in electric bicycles. We have simplified the certification process, we have completely abolished evaluators and introduced exclusively self-certification, we have simplified the certification contract, communication is now exclusively electronic. The big new is the website [www.vitajtecyklisti.sk](http://www.vitajtecyklisti.sk), which is clearer and more modern. A fundamental step was also the decision not to recognize any certification before 2020, so all tourist facilities were certified anew in 2023, while we mainly focused on improving processes and catching errors.
